the 14th Sunday in Ordinary Time

Isaias 66:10-14 Galatians 6:14-18 Luke 10:1-12, 17-20

In this week's gospel, it's time for the disciples of Jesus to take the message they have received from him and carry it out into the world around them. Can you imagine the youthful excitement, the energy of these new “converts” as they take off with the Good News in their pockets? And how much Jesus must have smiled at their good will, generosity and naivete. How much more they would need to learn before they really had THE Good News to share! How far do YOU still have to go?

Deut. 30:10-14 Colossians 1:15-20 Luke 10:25-37

This week we hear the Good Neighbor gospel. The famous story of the Good Samaritan uses the cultural prejudices of the people of the listeners to make the point that the deepest values in human nature are bigger and deeper than we can imagine, bigger and deeper than layers of tradition, class, status or wealth can overcome.
