Scripture Reflection for 16th Sunday in Ordinary Time

Genesis 18:1-10 Colossians 1:24-28 Luke 10:38-42

It's about hospitality. Both the story of Abraham and Sarah's spontaneous ministry to the three strangers and the gracious welcome of Martha and Mary to Jesus a few centuries later remind us that hospitality - warm, generous welcome into our homes and wherever - is a trademark of our faith. In today's world, some people seem to think hospitality is reserved for those "who have a right to be here." How do you stand on that?

Scripture Reflection for 17th Sunday in Ordinary Time

Genesis 18:20-32 Colossians 2:12-14 Luke 11:1-13

It's about prayer. It doesn't make that much difference how one prays. Abraham knew God so well he could bargain as he would with a fellow businessman. They were on a first-name basis! The disciples needed a little more structure and so Jesus gave them a formula to help them along. Hopefully they all made it eventually to Abraham's chatroom status or close to it.
