JUSTICE PRAYER/REFLECTION

After 13 visits to El Salvador, I have been immersed into the life and death of Archbishop Oscar Romero, martyr and soon-to-be-canonized saint. Thirty-eight years ago this weekend Romero was killed in the chapel of Divine Providence Hospital where he was celebrating Mass.

He was martyred because he was “a voice for the voiceless” people who were being terrorized and killed by the military. Romero championed the dignity of each person, rich and poor alike. He begged the country’s leadership to stop the repression/killing that targeted those who wished only to provide for their families and live without fear. Oscar Romero is still alive in the hearts and lives of humble Salvadorans. They remember his words:

“If they kill me, I will rise again in the Salvadoran People.”

For me, Romero’s life and death describe Holy Week. His life/death is the Paschal Mystery personified in our time. **If you wish to walk in the footsteps of Oscar Romero, consider joining the 2019 delegation to El Salvador, tentatively scheduled for January 10-19.**
